

Sweet Hour of Prayer



How to Pray for Personal Needs

There are personal needs to be met in your life for you to become more pleasing unto God. The request for each need is based on the Word of God. Therefore, it is God's will for these needs to be met.

1. Father, give me a heart that hungers for you.

O God, thou art my God; early will I seek thee: my soul thirsteth for thee, my flesh longeth for thee in a dry and thirsty land, where no water is; to see thy power and thy glory, so as I have seen thee in the sanctuary. Psalm 63:1-2

2. Father, teach me how to love you more.

And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. Deuteronomy 6:5

3. Father teach me how to seek you.

Seek the Lord and his strength, seek his face continually. I Chronicles 16:11

4. O Lord, teach me how to praise you.

I will bless the Lord at all time; his praise shall continually be in my mouth. Psalm 34:1

5. O Lord, teach me how to pray.

And it came to pass, that, as he was praying in a certain place, when he ceased, one of his disciples said unto him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples. Luke 11:1

6. O Lord, teach me how to study your Word.

How to Pray for Your Local Church

And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us: And if we know that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of him. I John 5:14-15

God hears and answers prayers that are prayed in His will. The Word of God reveals the Will of God. Powerful praying, therefore, is based on the Word of God.

1. I pray the members of my church will love God supremely and seek Him constantly.

Jesus said unto him Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. Matthew 22:37-39

2. I pray my local church will grow supernaturally, winning many lost souls to faith in Christ.

The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. II Peter 3:9

And he said unto them, Go ye unto all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.

Mark 16:15

3. I pray my local church will dwell in unity, loving, forgiving and caring for one another.

Fulfill ye my joy, that ye be like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. Philippians 2:2

By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another. John 13:35

How to Pray for World Missions and Evangelism

- I. Father, I pray **your people will obey your command** to share the gospel with every person in the world.

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. Mark 16:15

- II. Father, I pray **your people will be deeply convicted** that Jesus Christ is the one and only Savior of the world.

Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved. Mark 4:12

- III. Father, I pray **your people will recognize the urgency of the hour** in which we live to preach the gospel.

Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? Behold, I say unto you, lift up your eyes, and look on the fields: for they are white already to harvest. John 4:35

I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work. John 9:4

- IV. I pray that **all available resources** for world evangelism **will be identified and utilized** to share the gospel with every person on earth.

But ye shall received power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. Acts 1:8

- V. Lord Jesus, I pray that **you will thrust forth laborers** into your harvest fields all over the world.

But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd. Then saith he unto his disciples, the harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest. Matthew 9:36-38

- VI. Father, I pray **your people will never forget what it means to be lost without hope and without God** in this world and in the world to come.

And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works. Prayer in the Life of Jesus Christ

The life of Jesus Christ was characterized by prayer.

I. Jesus Prayed:

A. In the morning.

And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed.

Mark 1:35

B. Alone and in secret.

And when he had sent the multitudes away, he went up into a mountain apart to pray: and when the evening was come, he was there alone.

Matthew 14:23

But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.

Matthew 6:6

C. When He was baptized.

Now when all the people were baptized, it came to pass, that Jesus also being baptized, and praying, the heaven was opened.

Luke 3:21

D. When eating.

1. Feeding of 5,000

And he commanded the multitude to sit down on the grass, and took the five loaves, and the two fishes, and looking up to heaven, he blessed, and brake, and gave the loaves to his disciples, and the disciples to the multitude.

Matthew 14:19

2. Feeding of 4,000

And he took the seven loaves and the fishes, and gave thanks, and brake them, and gave to his disciples, and the disciples to the multitude.

Matthew 15:36

3. Lord's Supper

And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body."

Matthew 26:26

E. All night before choosing His Twelve Disciples.

And it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God. And when it was day, he called unto him his disciples: and of them he chose twelve, whom also he named apostles.

F. When He was Transfigured.

And as he prayed, the fashion of his countenance was altered, and his raiment was white and glistening.

- G. **Before giving the Lord's Prayer**
And it came to pass, that, as he was praying in a certain place, when he ceased, one of his disciples said unto him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.
 Luke 11:1
- H. **For all believers.**
 (Read John 17)
- I. **In the Garden of Gethsemane.**
And being in agony he prayed more earnestly: and his sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground.
 Luke 22:44
- J. **While hanging on the cross.**
And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, la-ma sa-bach-tha-ni? That is to say, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?
 Matthew 27:46
Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do.
 Luke 23:34
- II. **Jesus Taught Us to Pray:**
- A. **Believing.**
And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive.
 Matthew 21:22
- B. **Forgiving one another.**
And when ye stand praying, forgive, if ye have aught against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may forgive you and your trespasses. But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father which is in heaven forgive your trespasses.
 Mark 11:25-26
- C. **Agreeing with one another.**
Again I say unto you, that if two of you shall agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven.
 Matthew 18:19
- D. **In His Name.**
If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it.
 John 14:14
- E. **Abiding in Him and His words abiding in us.**
If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.
 John 15:7
- F. **Never giving up.**
 (Read Luke 18:1-8)

Prayer in the Life of the Early Church

- I. Prior to the Day of Pentecost the Disciples were with one accord in prayer (Acts 1:14).
- II. Following the Day of Pentecost they continued steadfastly...in prayer (Acts 2:42).
- III. Following the first persecution of the Jerusalem Christians, they called a meeting of fellow Christians (Acts 4:21-23), and lifted their voice in prayer (Acts 4:24), asking God to give them boldness to speak His Word (Acts:29). When they had prayed the place was shaken, they were filled with the Holy Ghost, they spake the Word of God with boldness (Acts 4:31).
- IV. Men, whom many believe were the first deacons, were chosen to enable the apostles to give themselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the Word (Acts 6:1-4).
- V. Stephen, the first Christian martyr, prayed while dying (Acts 7:59-60).
- VI. Peter was kept in prison. Prayer was made without ceasing of the church unto God for him (Acts 12:5). The angel of the Lord came and released him (Acts 12:6-11).
- VII. The church at Antioch fasted and prayed and sent out Saul (Paul) and Barnabas as missionaries (Acts 13:1-3).
- VIII. Paul ordained elders in every church, prayed with fasting, and commended the believers to the Lord (Acts 14:21-23).
- IX. After being beaten and placed in jail, Paul and Silas prayed and sang praises unto God (Acts 16:25).

How to Pray With Power

I. PRAY IN JESUS NAME

And whatsoever ye shall ask in My name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If ye shall ask anything in My name, I will do it. John 14:13-14

II. PRAY ABIDING IN JESUS AND HIS WORDS ABIDING IN YOU

If ye abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you. John 15:7

III. PRAY IN FAITH BELIEVING

And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive. Matthew 21:22

Therefore I say unto you, 'What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.' Mark 11:24

IV. PRAYING WITH SINS CONFESSED

If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me. Psalms 66:18

The Weapon of Prayer

II Corinthians 10:4; Ephesians 6:18; I Thessalonians 5:17

INTRODUCTION

There is an absolute necessity for earnest, fervent prayer if we are to live triumphantly as Christians. Every Christian soldier needs to keep in touch with his commander, Jesus Christ.

We must be constantly in prayer because we are constantly in danger. The battle is not ours, but God's. He alone can empower us to win.

Prayer should be as natural as breathing. Physically, we cannot survive without breathing. Spiritually, we cannot survive and thrive without prayer.

The Apostle Paul commanded us to pray without ceasing (I Thessalonians 5:17) and Jesus taught that man ought always to pray and not to faint (Luke 18:1).

Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints. Ephesians 6:18

I. Pray without ceasing.

- A. I Thessalonians 5:17
- B. Maintain an attitude of prayer. Learn to live in the conscious presence of God. Constantly acknowledge God's presence in your life.

II. Pray a variety of prayers.

There are many kinds of prayer . . .

- A. Intercession, which identifies with God's purposes.
- B. Thanksgiving, which recognizes God's grace and His riches.
- C. Praise, which focuses on God's attributes.
- D. Worship, which adores, loves, and honors God.
- E. Confession, which agrees with God regarding our sin.
- F. There is also private prayer, public prayer, silent prayer, audible prayer, family prayer, mealtime prayer, church prayer, and emergency prayer.

III. Pray led by the Holy Spirit.

Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought; but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.
Romans 8:26-27

And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask anything according to his will, he heareth us: And if we know that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of him. I John 5:14-15

IV. Pray alertly.

We are to be watchful, careful, and alert as we pray. We are to be aware of our enemies in spiritual warfare and of the urgency of the hour.

A. Nehemiah 4:7-9

B. Mark 13:32-33

V. Pray with persistence.

Don't give up. Don't stop praying. Be so concerned and burdened you will not quit praying until God answers you or the Holy Spirit leads you to cease praying about a given matter. See Luke 18:1-8

VI. Pray in faith.

Is any sick among you? Let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

James 5:14-16

Why God Does Not Answer your Prayers

I. They are Unasked

Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and shew thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not. Jeremiah 33:3

Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened to you.

Matthew 7:7

. . . Yet ye have not, because ye ask not.

James 4:2b

We call not. We ask not. Our Heavenly Father owns all, knows all, is everywhere present and possesses all power but many times as Christians we live as if God is dead or is greatly limited in power. Our lack of prayer, at least partially, reflect this attitude.

II. They Are Asked in Unbelief

If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive anything of the Lord. James 1:5-7

And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive.

Matthew 21:22

God honors faith. Without faith we cannot please God (Hebrews 11:6). We are saved by faith (Ephesians 2:8), justified by faith (Romans 5:1), walk by faith (II Corinthians 5:7), quench the fiery darts of the wicket by faith (Ephesians 6:16), and overcome the world by faith (I John 5:4). Therefore, we must have faith to get our prayers answered.

III. There Is Unconfessed Sin in Your Life.

If I regard iniquity in heart, the Lord will not hear me. Psalm 66:18

Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that it cannot hear: But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you, that he will not hear. Isaiah 59:1-2

And Whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his sight. And this is his commandment, That we should believe on the name of his Son Jesus Christ, and love one another, as he gave us commandment. I John 3:22-23

. . . The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. James 5:16b

God will not hear and answer our prayers if there is unconfessed, unforsaken sin in our life. To live boldly for God is to pray boldly to God. "The praying man will quit sinning and the sinning man will quit praying."

The unconfessed sin in your life may be:

1. Your unwillingness to forgive another person.

And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you. Ephesians 4:32

2. **Lack of love for others**

By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

John 13:35

3. **An improper motive.**

Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts.

James 4:3

4. **Discord in your marriage relationship.**

Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered.

I Peter 3:7

5. **Prayerlessness.**

Pray without ceasing.

I Thessalonians 5:17

6. **Not Studying the Bible.**

Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

II Timothy 2:15

7. **Not sharing the gospel.**

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature.
